We teach children in Year 1 a Letters and sounds curriculum which is a standalone lesson. We also cover SpAG objectives which focus on spellings, punctuation and grammar.

Reading

Please continue to listen to your child read **daily**. Whilst reading, ask them questions about the story/text, to ensure they have understood. Then sign or write a short comment in their Reading Record. Children receive stickers for their reading, which go on a bookmark. Once this bookmark is completed the children are then rewarded with a brag tag. This is awarded in a Key Stage assembly.
