In the pages that follow, you will find an overview of the curriculum areas and objectives that your child will be covering this term.

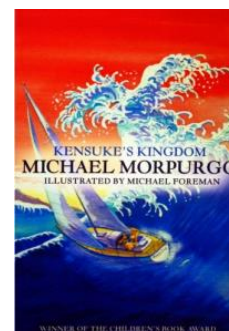
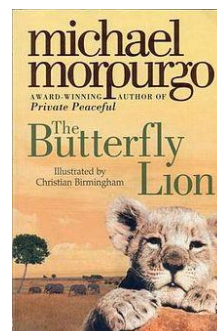
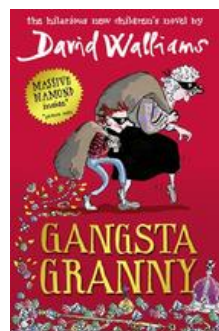
